Communicating Student Learning and Family Conferences

Teachers are assessing learning after the long summer break. Reading, writing and math assessments are all part of back to school in September.

Teachers will meet with parents on October 20 to discuss learning goals with parents and students. That day will be a non-instructional day to allow time for each child to schedule a 15-minute meeting to discuss student growth in literacy, numeracy, and social-emotional learning. Students are encouraged to attend along with their parent/guardian to have a voice and to take ownership of their learning. If you find you need more time with your child's teacher, you are encouraged to set up a meeting time. Stay tuned for the online sign up for these conferences. School Learning Plan

This year our school goal is to improve basic <u>math facts</u> at grade level. This skill is important as math problems become more advanced and being able to add and subtract, multiply and divide is necessary for success. We are also delving into <u>writing clear sentences</u> that build paragraphs. Grade level <u>spelling and punctuation</u> will be a big focus in our writing goal this year.

Parent Volunteers and Drivers

Parent volunteers in schools and drivers follow a strict protocol to ensure our students are safe. All volunteers will need to complete the first two items. Drivers will need to complete all four requirements.

- 1. School Volunteer Registration Form.
- 2. Criminal record check (call the school to receive a password for the online check), Every 3 years or every 5 years for school district employees.
- 3. Photocopy of the volunteer's driver's license, vehicle registration, and insurance each year.

Foundational Skills Assessment

Beginning in October, students in grades 4 and 7 will take the **FSA** which is an assessment to measure reading, writing and numeracy skills. Every student in BC in these two grades writes this test as a way to measure learning across the years. Our students will write this assessment in their classrooms throughout the month of October. Parents will receive their scores in the new year.

Food Programs at Grindrod

<u>Breakfast:</u> We are grateful for Sheila Young who provides a variety of breakfast items for students before school each day. She creates healthy smoothies, egg muffins, bagels and cream cheese and sometimes pancakes. There are always fruit and vegetables offered each morning. This is available to all our students who need an extra boost to start their day at school.

<u>Lunch:</u> We always have fresh fruit and vegetables along with boiled eggs and sandwiches for students who find they are still hungry after eating all their lunch. We require students to eat their own lunches first and then if they are still hungry, they are welcome to come to the kitchen for a few extra items. Our CEA's and student leaders look after the preparation and handing out of the food.

Milk Program: We are grateful to the Verbeek family (Kenna and Joey's grandparents) who donate milk to our school twice a month to each student. Students choose white or chocolate milk at the beginning of the school year. Milk products are an important part of a healthy diet. Thanks to Brandy for delivering the milk to our school.

Soup Day Program: Each Tuesday, a free bowl of soup, bun and fruit will be provided to all students from the Feeding Futures Program. Parent volunteers will be needed to serve and clean up the bowls. Leadership students will assist with serving. Please sign up for one or two days to help serve soup this term. The sign up is on the bulletin board outside the office. The first Soup Day is Tuesday October 7 with Mac and Cheese. Souper meals will follow every Tuesday, pending parent volunteer availability.

Askews Gift Card Fundraiser

Grindrod School will continue this great fundraiser involving Askews Foods. We have gift cards available in many denominations for sale. The gift card can be used the same as cash at any Askews in Armstrong, Salmon Arm, Enderby or Sicamous. The school receives 8% back from each gift card we sell. This money goes directly to field trips to help us pay for the many bus trips we take each year.

Halloween

Halloween is one month away, and students are invited to dress up in costumes for the day. We will have a costume parade in the morning along with a month end assembly and the grade 5-7's will have a dance in the afternoon. Please ensure your child can get dressed in their costumes as young children can get quite frustrated when their costume needs adjusting. We also ask that costumes are appropriate for school as young children can get very frightened by gory and scary costumes. Please, no toy weapons at school. Save that for Halloween evening. Student Leadership will be planning a Halloween Contest as well as a dance for grades 5-7. Details will be coming home soon.
